

Globe & Mail bestselling Lesley Crewe's new novel brings readers to 1960s Montreal & features a nosy would-be child detective searching for the truth about her mother.

It's 1967 in Montreal, the Expo is in full swing, and Audrey Parker has just moved with her dad to Notre-Dame-de-Grâce, a whole new neighbourhood full of different kinds of people to spy on. Audrey is a lot of things: articulate, disarming, forthright. And, as her father reminds her often, indecently nosy.

Audrey scribbles every observation down in her notebooks—from which foods her new teacher eats for lunch, to how blue the water is in Greece, to what time the one-legged man across the street gets home. She is certain she will soon root out a murderer or uncover a mystery. But there's only one mystery that really matters to her: her mother. Who was she? How did she die? Why won't her father ever talk about her?

Over a year of Audrey's life, we bike with her through the streets of NDG, encountering stray animals, free-range kids, and adults both viciously cruel and wonderful. And we walk with Audrey across the threshold from childhood to adolescence, where she will discover the truth about her mother.


Balancing humour and sadness as expertly as ever, author Lesley Crewe—who has so often captured Cape Breton perfectly on the page—turns her incisive observations for the first time to the NDG of the 1960s, where she grew up.

Lesley Crewe is the author of twelve novels, including the *Globe & Mail* bestselling *The Spoon Stealer, Beholden, Mary, Mary, Amazing Grace, Kin*, and *Relative Happiness*, which has been adapted into a feature film. Tales of Home and Family

By L.M. Montgomery; Edited by Joanne Lebold

A heartwarming collection of 17 rare short stories by famed *Anne of Green Gables* author.

Although best known for creating the spirited Anne Shirley, L. M. Montgomery had a thriving writing career that included hundreds of short stories and poems. *Around the Hearth* is a continuation of the Montgomery short story collections edited by Rea Wilmshurst in the late 1980s and the early 1990s, including stories such as "A Baking of Gingersnaps" (1895)—the first story Montgomery published. As with Anne, who found a warm and welcoming home and family at Green Gables, these stories focus on homes and families, and the happiness and love people receive from them.

Over many years of careful research and meticulous compiling of resources, Joanne Lebold has curated a collection of short fiction that showcases all the warmth and charisma Montgomery's fans have come to cherish, and offers a rare glimpse into some of the beloved author's lesser-known works. Includes seventeen short stories originally published between 1895 and 1935.


Joanne (Wood) Lebold has been studying the life and works of L. M. Montgomery for over thirty-five years. A founding member of The Kindred Spirits Society of Hamilton in 1995, Joanne was also the editor of their newsletter, "The Road to L. M. Montgomery." Joanne contributed three chapters to *The Lucy Maud Montgomery Album* (1999), and has also written guest articles for "The Shining Scroll" and "The Avonlea Traditions Chronicle." Joanne lives in picturesque Hockley Valley, Ontario.

Lucy Maud (L. M.) Montgomery (1874-1942) was a Canadian author best known for her popular *Anne of Green Gables* series, the first book of which was released in 1908. The PEI-born author studied literature at Dalhousie University in Halifax, and went on to publish twenty novels and hundreds of short stories and poems. Montgomery's work has inspired movies, television shows, musicals, plays, and continues to draw countless visitors to Prince Edward Island each year.





Birth Road

A bold and evocative work of historical fiction by a debut author that travels from rural Nova Scotia to Boston and back again, told in startling vignettes.

My mother was not one to dwell on the past. "Digging up old memories is like eating cherries," she said. "Some people choose the sweet ones every time, and then there are the others, those who always choose the sour."

I don't agree with my mother. I have always liked the sweet and the sour. You really can't appreciate one without the other. Memories are like that, too.

Told in startling vignettes and with bold, impeccable prose, *Birth Road* is a story of love, lost innocence, and the secrets that so often haunt small places.

Set in early twentieth-century Nova Scotia, our story follows the naive but curious Helen, as she recalls the relationships and significant moments that have led to the birth of her child. Born in the grip of poverty to a cruel mother and a gentle but absent father, Helen's life follows a surprising path as she is moved from one place to another, constantly leaving the people she cares about behind. The love she has for her best friend Madge and her husband Edgar are tested as her journey is overshadowed by rumours and secrecy. Her loving Aunt Gertie, whose voice is like the summer rain, guides her with humour and wisdom as she grows into a woman.

Throughout it all, Helen takes in the world around her, but with an innocence that lets it break her heart over and over again. Why is Madge's family so sad? Why does her brother hate their mother? Why have the details of her parents' marriage been kept a secret? As Helen grows, she slowly unravels family secrets, and finds the life she's been building is one she never expected. Moving from the woodlands of rural Nova Scotia to the city streets of Boston and back again, *Birth Road* is the powerful story of a woman desperate to live life on her own terms.






My race duality has given me a unique perspective on both the Black and white experience in Canada.... A need to inform and educate so that hopefully, in due time, we can achieve real change.

As a bilingual, biracial man, straddling Black and white, English and French Canada, Stephen Dorsey lives in a world of dualities. In his deeply personal and insightful debut, he offers readers intimate and unfiltered access to his lived experience of anti-Black racism around the world, including Canada, the United States, and Europe, focusing on his formative years growing up in 1970s Montreal as a Black child in a white family headed by a racist stepfather, and details his personal awakening inspired by the Black Lives Matter movement.

A powerful blend of autobiography and social analysis, *Black & White* is an intimate excavation of systemic racism in North America—from our health-care and education systems, to policing and law, to a deep analysis of the uniquely intersectional discrimination faced by minorities in Dorsey's home province of Quebec. With an inclusive and accessible approach, aimed at community connection and education, Dorsey delves deep into Canada's history of racial discrimination and, by contrasting it with that of our American neighbours, debunks our nation's mythological narrative, providing necessary context on white privilege, which he calls "white advantage," and offers concrete pathways to lasting societal change.

Holding readers gently to account, Black & White is the book for the ally in all of us.

Stephen Dorsey is a senior-level business, brand, and marketing strategist, with nearly three decades of experience, and a creative writer, director, and producer of visual content. Today, he is the principal of The Fractional CMO, a strategic consultancy, and of Dorsey Studios, a content production development company. A civically engaged community leader, Stephen is a founding member and board member of Democracy House, a grassroots think tank and civic-minded movement dedicated to preserving and strengthening democratic systems and practices in Canada and around the world. He has written numerous articles, most notably a 2020 opinion piece on "White Advantage" in the *Globe & Mail*. A proud father of two lovely young children, Stephen lives in Roncesvalles, Toronto. *Black & White* is his first book.

The eponymous character of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's epic poem, *Évangéline*, is an Acadian girl searching for her long-lost love, Gabriel, during the Expulsion of the Acadians (1755–1764). Originally published in 1847, Longfellow's poem throws into sharp relief a dark chapter of Canada's history, while also showcasing a strong female character that has left an indelible mark on generations of Acadians, French Canadians, Cajuns, and Creoles.

Examining aspects both historical and literary that led to Évangéline's idolization across countries, cultures, and decades, sociologist Joseph Yvon Thériault presents three versions of the celebrated heroine: Évangéline the Acadian, Évangéline the Canadian, and Évangéline the American. The crux of his narrative seeks to understand if these three distinct identities might be merged, and whether they will survive the effects of globalization.

Passionate and engaging, *Évangéline* is a postmodern study on the many interpretations of this literary icon, and the melting pot of cultures she has traversed and influenced. Features a colour photo insert.

Joseph Yvon Thériault has been studying the challenges of memory and collective identities in societies for more than thirty years, with a particular interest in the Francophonies of America. He is the author of *Identity in the Test of Modernity* (1995) and *Critique of Americanity: Memory and Democracy in Quebec* (2005). He is currently a professor of sociology at the University of Quebec in Montreal.



Painted Worlds

The Art of Maud Lewis, A Critical Perspective

By Dr. Laurie Dalton

A full-colour, narrative and illustrated critical art history of the works of iconic Nova Scotia artist Maud Lewis.

"Rather than thinking of Maud Lewis as an artist who was untrained, unskilled, and worked in total isolation, we ought to reframe her as an artist who, through her observation of landscape and culture, created composite images of what inspired her."

Upon seeing the title of this work, you could be forgiven for asking, "Another book about Maud Lewis? Is there anything left to say, or is this just one more voice laying claim to her story and legacy?" After all, Lewis's work has been marketed and co-opted as part of the larger folk identity in Nova Scotia for decades. But something has been missing from that discourse all these years.

In *Painted Worlds*, Dalton explores what always seems to be lacking in the storytelling and mythmaking surrounding Maud Lewis: she situates Lewis's work within a wider context of art history. Discussions of technique, intent, and colour theory permeate these pages. Instead of reducing Lewis to her cute black cats and whimsical rural scenes, Dalton takes us on a deep dive of the artist's oeuvre, through the lens of critical art history inquiry. That is, Dalton does not simply regard the paintings as ethnographic objects of rural Nova Scotia, but as serious works of art to be carefully examined. The result is a rigorous analysis that grants Lewis's work—and thus, her legacy—the dignity and respect it so deserves.

Dr. Laurie Dalton, is the director/curator of the Acadia University Art Gallery and an adjunct art historian in the Department of History & Classics. Her research interests lie in Canadian visual culture and heritage, and exhibition history, in particular how "meaning" is a process of display, didactics, and audience exchange. She lives in Nova Scotia.




Halifax women won the Second World War—but not in the ways you might have been told. We all know the stories of Canadian women during the war who trained as machinists, welders, and streetcar drivers to fill the shoes of men who answered the call. We know how women kept the home fires lit while their husbands, brothers, and fathers fought. This is not that story.

The Volunteers: How Halifax Women Won the Second World War is the untold story of Halifax women who geared up in a flash to focus on the comfort, community connections, and mental health of Halifax's exploding population of sailors, soldiers, airmen, and merchant mariners. They did a job no government could have organized or afforded. They did it without being asked. And they did it with no respite from their daily duties.

Thoroughly researched and compellingly told, and with a dozen archival images, *The Volunteers* examines the untold stories of the hardworking women whose unpaid and unacknowledged labour won the Second World War.

Lezlie Lowe is a Halifax-based freelance journalist, broadcaster, and author who has an abiding fascination with flipping on the lights above society's unexamined everyday. She has been a finalist and multiple winner at the Radio Television Digital News Association Awards, the Atlantic Journalism Awards, the Canadian Association of Journalists Awards, and the Atlantic Book Awards. She has taught journalism at the University of King's College since 2003.


Nancy Regan has interviewed many of the biggest stars in the entertainment industry— Oprah, Madonna, and Harrison Ford to name just a few—and has a gift for putting people at ease. But while studiously projecting confidence, the beloved *Live at 5* host often struggled with insecurity, imposter syndrome, perfectionism, and fear of failure.

In her first book, Regan offers up her own life experience and struggles in vulnerable and honest prose, exploring how overcoming these challenges enriched her life and now fuels her ability to help others. Nancy Regan is a professional communicator whose talents include TV and podcast hosting, emceeing, and presentation coaching. She also conducts executive interviews with business leaders as an engaging way to communicate their message—and personality—to employees, colleagues, and customers, and legacy interviews with individuals who wish to preserve their life stories for their families. Nancy built her reputation as the highly rated host of CTV Atlantic's *Live at 5* for fifteen years, broadcasting to a daily audience of over a quarter million viewers. 



The people of Truro mobilized, passing a resolution that everyone should be obliged to turn out with brushes to whitewash the town. Within forty-eight hours, Truro looked like a new place, and in the aftermath of the rush to honour their esteemed visitor, they discovered something about their own dignity. From that day, the people of Truro have taken pride in their town and they work hard to always have it present its best appearance.


With more than ninety meticulously hand-drawn illustrations by Minette Murphy, and featuring Joseph Ballard's carefully researched histories, *Sketches of Historic Truro* offers a unique and beautiful inventory of Truro's most handsome historic architecture, including the Truro Federal Building (designed by Thomas Fuller, once the Chief Dominion Architect for the Government of Canada), Seton Hall (a wonderful example of a Second Empire—style mansion), and the Beaux Arts—style Colchester Historeum.

Joseph M. A. Ballard is the author of *Historic House Names of Nova Scotia* and *Fairy Dells & Rustic Bowers*. Ballard has served as a director with the Genealogical Association of Nova Scotia (president), Heritage Trust of Nova Scotia (president), Colchester Historical Society (president), Maritime Institute for Civil Society (VP of Market Development), Town of Truro Heritage Advisory Committee (chair), and a number of other heritage organizations.

Minette Murphy is an aspiring architect from Nova Scotia with an interest in heritage. They took up house portraiture as a means for documenting buildings at risk of demolition. This led to many commissioned house portraits, a feature in the Heritage Trust of Nova Scotia's quarterly, *The Griffin*, and this collaboration with Joseph Ballard on an in-depth documentation of some of Truro's most prized buildings.

But Joe waits too long to tell her his deepest secret, and soon she is forced to deal with two losses. In the end, Dot's weird way of looking at the world is the one thing that will, against the odds, help her connect with it.

With breakneck wordplay and the most motley of crews—human and otherwise— Decoding Dot Grey is a tender and delightful novel from the award-winning author of *In* the Wake.







Since the Renaissance, liberal education has as its core tradition a Eurocentric multidisciplinary humanism—the study of literature, art, philosophy and history—grounded in ancient Greek and Latin texts.

In what may be termed cognitive imperialism, the academy has largely ignored Aboriginal perspectives of humanity. In this volume, Mi'kmaw and non-Mi'kmaw scholars, teachers and educators posit an interdisciplinary approach to explicate and animate a Mi'kmaw Humanities.

Drawing on the metaphor of a basket as a multilayered metaphor for engaging postsecondary institutions, these essays reveal historical, educational, legal, philosophical, visual and economic frameworks to develop a knowledge protocol that can direct, transform and enrich conventional Humanities within the complex dynamics of territory, energy, stewardship, alterity and consciousness.


Paul MacEwan (1943-2017) was a singular politician, an outlier who successfully pushed the limits of Nova Scotia's political norms over the longest continuous service record in the history of the legislature. Yet he never achieved the sort of prominence such a record might command—though serving as Speaker (1993-1996), he was never made a cabinet minister.

MacEwan's brand of constituent-centred politics saw him victorious in nine consecutive general elections over thirty-three years, a record unlikely to fall anytime soon. At the same time, he didn't fit into the club-like atmosphere of the legislature. Obsessive, at times bombastic, few politicians have been as polarizing as MacEwan. He made few friends and rarely socialized with other legislators; instead he was always "on-call" for his constituents.

lan Stewart PhD, taught at both Queen's and UBC before joining the department of political science at Acadia University for 32 years. Conventional Choices was short-listed for the Donald Smiley Prize for the best book on Canadian politics in 2008, and Just One Vote was short-listed for the Margaret McWilliams for best book on Manitoba history and for the Donald Smiley Prize for the best book in Canadian politics in 2010. During what her daughter called her mother's "hazardous, solitary adventure" in a farmhouse with no electricity or plumbing, Elizabeth grapples daily with the long lists of tasks to be completed: fencing for the garden, log-splitting for the wood stove, painting boats, digging for water, repairing her sewing machine, and fixing the fridge among them, not to mention checking on her sheep.

Though she has help and company both human and animal (including her dog, cats, the sheep, the squirrels, and some tame deer), her journal reveals the hardship, the rewards, and the self-awareness that come from a life lived on land and sea. Despite the strength in her fifty-year-old body, she feels the effects of the unrelenting work. "Privy door frozen shut this morning," she writes. "Logs like splitting into stone. My shoulder is suffering the strains of survival." She sums up: "Survival is all here." The compensations are in the satisfaction of keeping the house warm and dry, surveying the beauty of the sunsets, and enjoying the visits from friends, family, her pets, and the local wildlife.


McNutt's Island Journal is one woman's compelling account of living in a place where you must rely on your own resilience and stamina each and every day.

Caught in a Changing Society captures the ensuing debate that led to the closure of the 114-year-old St. Dunstan's University and the resolve that allowed the institution to evolve into a charitable foundation that has invested more than 32 million dollars into education, infrastructure, and the diocese.

Leonard Cusack graduated from St. Dunstan's University in 1969 and has a Master of Arts degree in Canadian History from the University of New Brunswick. During his career, Leonard was a high school teacher and principal, a public servant, and a sessional lecturer in history at the University of Prince Edward Island. His previous books include A Magnificent Gift Declined: The Dalton Sanatorium of Prince Edward Island 1913-1923; A Party for Progress: The P.E.I. Progressive Conservative Party 1770-2000; and Owen Connolly: The Making of a Legacy 1820-2016.










