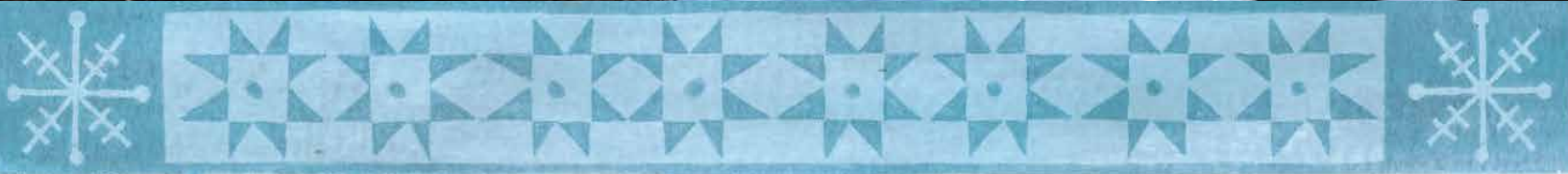




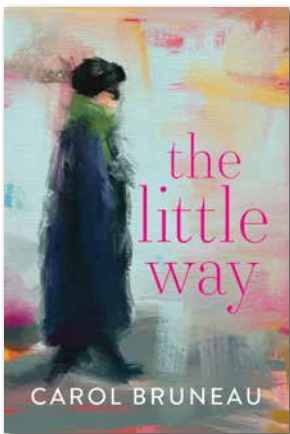

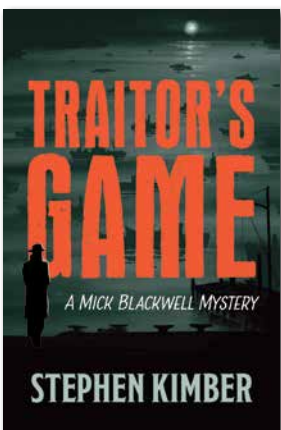

The daughter of Newfoundland's most prestigious merchant family, adored by her father and emotionally abused by her mother, Iris Woodsen grows up shrouded in shame and insecurity. When her desires are pathologized, she is sent to an institution to be cured, and then forced to marry a man she does not love. The only way out is to disappear, but her husband will stop at nothing to find her.

Spanning the vast terrain of the 1930s to the 1960s, Newfoundland to New York City, *Green Eye Blue* is a mesmerizing story of trauma and healing, and finding one's own path to authenticity.

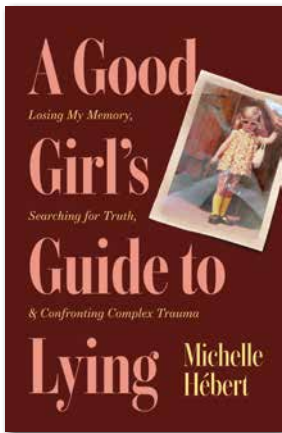

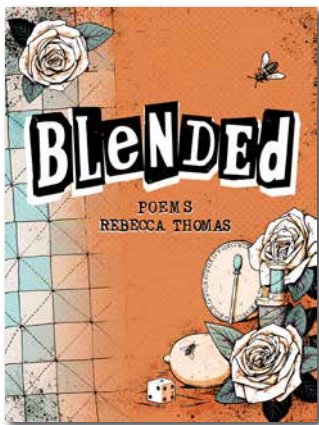

Why did her mind disconnect from her body for long periods. A mystery disguised as a memoir, this deeply layered story of complex trauma is a heartbreaking, darkly humorous, and redemptive story of resilience, and a compelling testament to the lengths our brains will go to protect us.

Michelle Hébert's stories and essays have appeared in magazines and newspapers across North America and have aired on CBC Radio.
